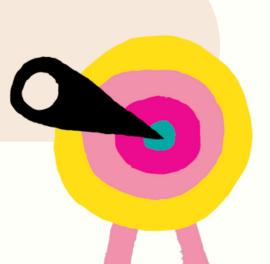

1 - The CFL wishes





The 12 wishes represent the voices of 80,000 children/young people (<u>find out more about the 12</u> <u>wishes and how they were formed</u>). The team continues to use the wishes as a framework to drive positive change and, in 2024, the CFL team has...

Created a film to promote the refreshed 12 wishes. In the first 4 months live on YouTube, it has received 94 views.

Added a category to the CFL awards for 'exceptional contribution to the CFL 12 wishes' and received 41 nominations in this category.

Delivered a 12-month communications campaign to raise awarenss of the wishes with a total reach of 116k.

2 - Play Sufficiency



Play Sufficiency is the ongoing process of research and action to assess, improve and protect children's play. Active Leeds and Child Friendly Leeds work in partnership on this approach and took a report to Executive Board in December 2023.

So, what have we done this year to improve children's time, space and permission to play?



10k income

Consulted on a project with NESTA which culminated in the creation of 7 playful installations at a community hub, generating £10k income for CFL.

Managed the Play Sufficiency Strategic Partnership board meetings, working to deliver the 9 researchinformed priorities in the Play Sufficiency action plan CFL coauthored.

2 - Play Sufficiency



Festival of Play content was created and shared on CFL social media to promote play streets and the events taking place:

Delivered a press release to promote the festival, which was picked up by Yorkshire Evening Post and the BBC Radio Leeds and BBC online.

Shared the story of play sufficiency in Leeds and our commitment to play at various events or workshops, including: TCPA Conference; LGA Annual Conference; Starlight Symposium; Play England Webinar.

In partnership with LCC Planning, submitted evidence to the Levelling Up Housing and Communities (LUHC) inquiry (find out more), and were invited to the December 2024 review at the House of Lords. Leeds were called the 'gold standard' by Alice Ferguson, in reference to the 'Play Strategy Officer' post in the CFL team.

Established a Play Sufficiency communications working group to share the power of play, representing multiple LCC directorates as well as 3rd sector groups, with more joining in 2025.

3 - SEND



The CFL team are supporting the Council in improving outcomes for CYP with SEND. In 2024, they co-led a project called 'Raising Awareness of Hidden Disabilities...What young people want you to know'.

Worked with the Voice Influence and Change team to analyse the words and ideas of 50 young people from 5 different settings. From this analysis, themes and direct quotes from young people were used to create 3 posters.

Worked with the Public Health Resource Centre to distribute over 100 posters. The poster are shown in locations such as schools and doctors waiting rooms.

Created and delivered an assembly aimed at Primary age-phase. Offered to deliver it in schools during October assemblies

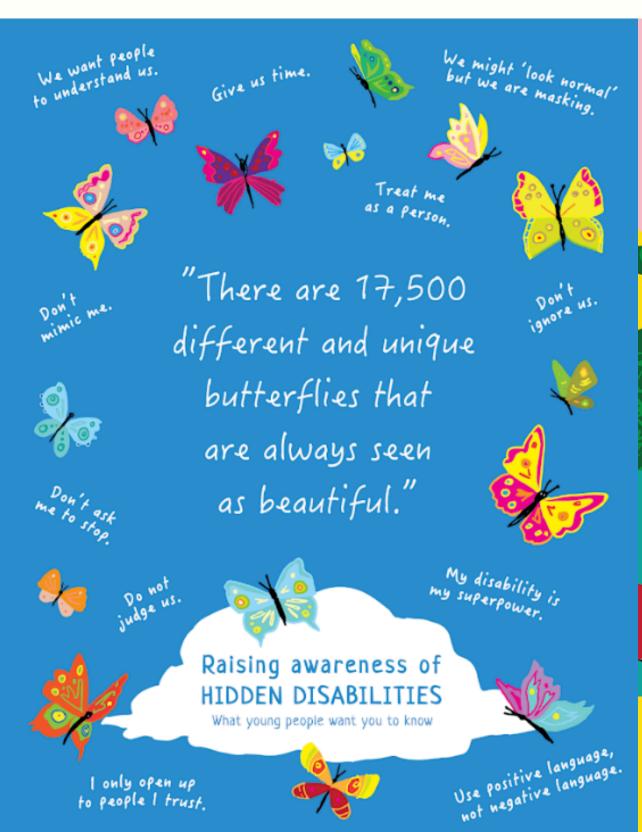

Arcadis

This year, Arcadis have aligned their social value work to the Child Friendly Leeds wishes, ensuring that their work is motivated by the voices of children and young people in Leeds.

- CFL teamed up with Arcadis to put on a workshop aimed at schools, for International Women in Engineering Day hosted by Wellington Place. We promoted the event to schools and 7 learning settings and 40 individuals attended.
- Staff away day. CFL provided an opportunity for Arcadis for their voluntary away day and, as a result, provided 144 hours of community volunteering valuable support with the upkeep of Herd Farm, a residential site for children in Leeds.

- Invited us to their community Iftar and partnership events.



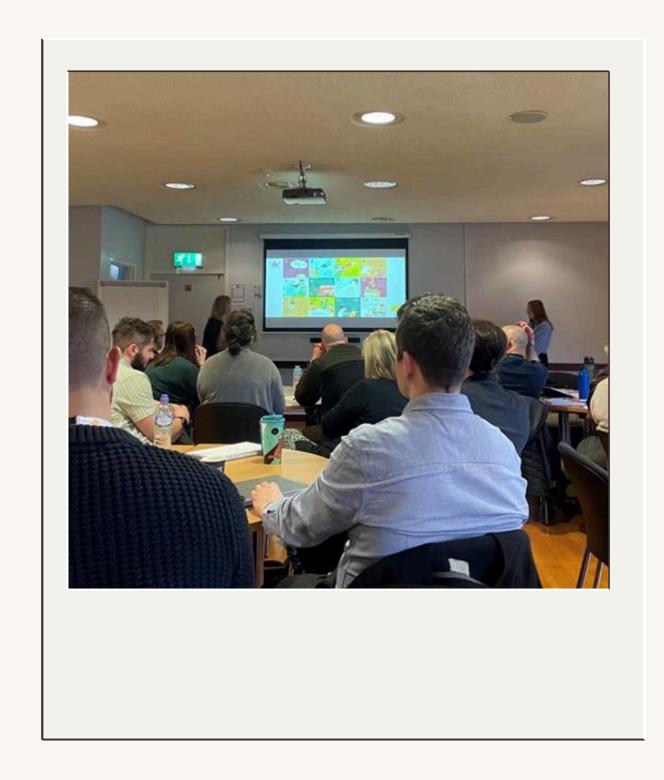

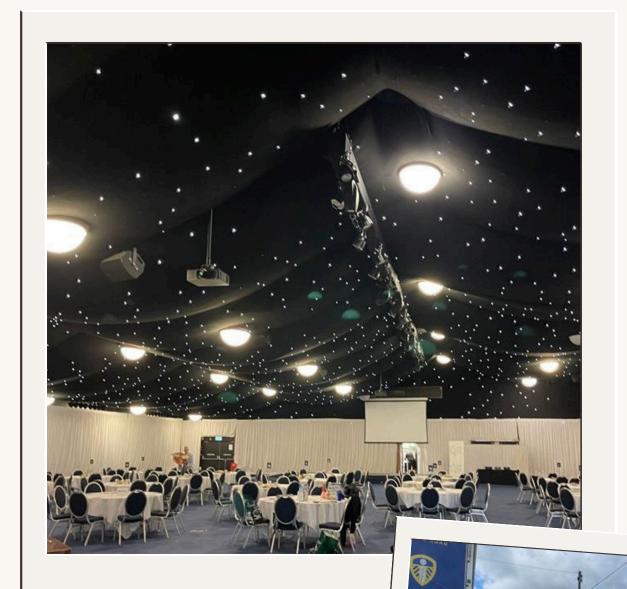

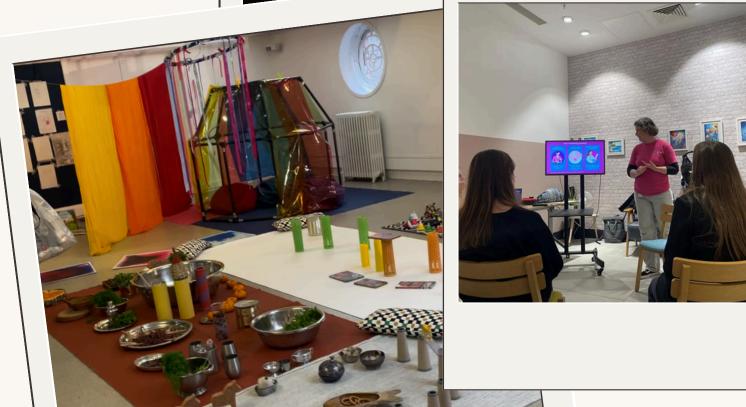
